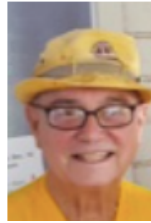

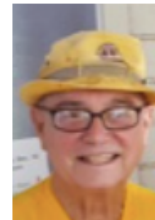

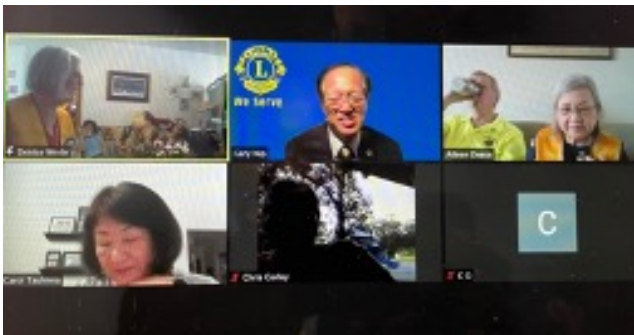


First Vice District Governor Update
