Until the Lions year starts on July 1, 2021, Lion Gary is called the First Vice District Governor Elect (1VDGE). 2VDGE Chris "CJ" Kalopodes (Kaneohe Lions Club) and DGE Mitch Tam (Lions Club of Kona) are the other officers elected at the recent District 50 Convention held on May 14 & 15, 2021. The Convention was the first virtual Convention due to Covid-19 and despite a few technical glitches the Convention Series did a great job. The elections were preceded by the nominating speech by Lion President James Campbell and the

seconding speech by PDG Bob Lee. (Lion President James mentioned we are "planning a big 75th Charter Celebration next summer and hope the District can join us and DG Gary"). A "Demonstration" was then held in support of the candidates. At an in-person convention, Lions would march around the conference room. At the virtual Convention each attendee was provided a paper fan with Lion Gary's famous face thanks to Lion Richard Kaneko. The 85th District 50 (D50) Convention was held on May 14 & 15, 2021. The Convention was the first virtual Convention due to Covid-19 and despite a few technical glitches the Convention Committee did a great job. On Thursday May 13, there was a D50 Lions golf tournament followed by the 4th D50 Cabinet meeting via Zoom at 2pm. That evening we held the traditional Flag Night honoring the flags of the United States, Hawaii and New York state (Guest speaker Past International President Al Brandel is from New York.)

On Friday May 14, the Convention began with annual business followed by the annual meeting of the Hawaii Lions Foundation (HLF). All Lions are members of the HLF. The traditional "Parade of Checks" was conducted where Clubs (including Koko Head Lions Club) and individual Lions donate money to HLF. That night was called "Fun Night" with contests for prizes which included best hat and best decorated Lion Gary face fan. Our own Lion Shasta won prizes in both contests. Comedian Frank De Lima performed live and made us all laugh via Zoom.



On Saturday we honored Lions who passed away since we last held our

Convention in 2019. Lion President James

Campbell represented our club and spoke about the late Lion Ted Aratani.

During the Awards portion of the Convention, seven clubs including Hawaii Kai Lions Club earned the Stellar Club award. Hilo and Aloha Pono Lions Club won the membership awards. (It was noted there are now 1,565 members in D50 with 41.6% women Lions to include new Lions Arlene, Debra and Shasta) Proud Lions pins were awarded to several Lions to include Lions Debra, Arlene, Michael and Shasta. Lion Gary was awarded the Proud Lion Elite. The Humanitarian award was presented to Rev. Tad Iwata. (Our Club nominee Laura Ruby of the Mo'ili'ili Cemetery is a winner in our hearts.)






move on to the District competition. Posters from Kindergarten student Tatienne (left) and 4th Grader Saige (right), both from Holy Nativity School moved on to the District competition.

Mo'ili'ili Japanese Cemetery Installation of the Lion's Seal & Plaque

On May 17th and 18th, four of us got together to install our Lions' Seal and Plaque into the left column of the entrance to the Mo'ili'ili Japanese Cemetery. In charge was Laura Ruby, Mo'ili'ili Hongwanji; Dean Uehara, mason; Lion Gavin Hall and myself. We took five hours on Monday to drill out the two locations and four hours on Tuesday to install and grout the two items.



This first picture shows Laura and I centering and leveling the inscription with a measuring tape. She then scribed the shape for Dean to drill out. Look closely and you can see where the Lions' seal has already been scribed. No, the alignment did not come out looking like that!

Second picture shows Laura is tapping holes where the guide screws are going into the wall. This was done for one hole on the plaque and two holes on the inscription.





Picture number three shows Dean starting drilling out the alignment holes. Two for the inscription are already done. He is working on the plaque hole.

The next three pictures show the holes being drilled out. You can see the scribe marks which will be drilled out to make the holes. The last picture shows Laura lining up the inscription.

The next three pictures are of the continuation of drilling out the holes for the Seal and the Plaque. The middle picture shows the scribe marks that make it easier to drill out







the stone areas. The alignment holes have been drilled and can be seen if you look carefully.
